TECHNIQUE ADVANTAGES

The Differential Straight-Arch® Technique is a comprehensive, fixed orthodontic appliance that facilitates learning because it is divided into three stages of treatment. The bracket has the following advantages:

- It reduces the need for functional appliances, head gear, or any distalizing mechanics.
- Extraction cases can be treated much easier.
- Teeth can be moved using light forces without anchorage strain.
- It reduces the need for orthognathic surgery.
- Anterior deep bites can be opened without the need for bite planes.


COURSE ADVANTAGES



limits his practice primarily to orthodontics and is a member of the American Dental Association, the Academy of General Dentistry, and local dental societies.

As a member of the Academy, he completed the 12-Session Comprehensive hands-on course in orthodontics in 1998 and has hosted the clinical facility providing patients for the Cedar Park, Texas hands-on course site since 2001.

Bert Vasut, D.D.S. graduated from the University of Texas in Austin in 1981 with a degree in Biology. FEES AND CDE HOURS

Tuition for the 12-session course (minimum of 150 CDE hours) is \$14,990 USD, including two years of Academy membership. Earn up to 225 CDE hours by monitoring the next course at no additional charge. Our Introductory Orthodontic Session (6 CDE hours) is \$150 USD and has a twofold purpose. Use it as an introductory trial session, with a 5 day timeframe to register and confirm enrollment in the 12-session course. Or, enroll in the 12-session course in advance and use it as Session I a working weekend with lecture and clinical patients. Our Introductory Weekend Session (12 CDE hours) is \$200 USD and is required for that specific 12-session course. Either Introductory Session fee will be waived if the participant enrolls in the full course. A CDE hours verification record is given to participants upon completion of the course. Associate Fellowship status is awarded upon satisfactory completion of the course as outlined in the hands-on course syllabus.

MEMBERSHIP

Two years of membership in the Academy is included in the course tuition. After that, membership dues are \$295 USD per year. Membership includes a certificate, quarterly newsletter/journal, a reference CD with patient forms/letters and marketing materials to help you incorporate orthodontics into your practice. 






ARMAMENTARIUM


